

ORDINANCE NO. 05-511

**AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF  
THE CITY OF MAYWOOD AMENDING THE  
MAYWOOD MUNICIPAL CODE REGARDING  
ALL-NIGHT PARKING PERMITS**

**WHEREAS**, the City of Maywood's residential Streets are narrow and there is a shortage of off-street parking; and

**WHEREAS**, parking of vehicles on City streets between the hours of 2:00 a.m. and 6:00 a.m. is prohibited without an all-night parking permit; and

**WHEREAS**, under existing ordinances, not more than two all-night parking permits may be issued to any address or three in the event a hardship is established ; and

**WHEREAS**, due to young families growing up, and other conditions, it creates a hardship to limit the number of all-night parking permits to three; and

**WHEREAS**, minimal investigation into the issuance of overnight parking permits will be required pursuant to the amendments established herein; therefore no investigation fee is required; and

**WHEREAS**, the City Council finds that the current annual renewal fee for overnight parking permits is too high.

**NOW THEREFORE, THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF MAYWOOD DOES HEREBY ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:**

Section 1. Article 1 of Chapter 3 of Title 4 of Maywood Municipal Code is hereby amended in the following particulars:

A. Section 4-3.1.101 is hereby amended to read as follows:

**"Sec. 4-3.101. Permits: Required: Exceptions**

- A. It shall be unlawful for any person stop, stand, or park any motor vehicle between the hours of 2:00 a.m. and 6:00 a.m. of any day on any street so designated by resolution of the Council, which resolution shall be published in accordance with State law no later than fifteen (15) days after the adoption thereof, unless such person shall have obtained an all-night parking permit as provided in this article. Not more than one all-night parking permits may be issued for each licensed driver at each residential address in the City of Maywood. No such permit shall be issued so as to permit the parking of any vehicle which is in excess of ninety (90) inches in width or which 6,000 pounds or more in gross weight.
- B. The provision of this article shall not apply to emergency vehicles, hybrid vehicles, or to two-wheeled vehicles such as motorcycles and motor scooters which are parked in such a manner as to not interfere with automobile parking.
- C. Licensed drivers entitled to issuance of permits shall be any person whose drivers license or DMV change of address certificate shows the address in question as the person's address. In addition, any person whose drivers license shows a different address shall be entitled to issuance of a permit if he or she presents a recent gas or electrical bill in his or her name showing service at, and bills mailed to, the subject address, and executes a sworn declaration under penalty of perjury stating that the subject address is his or her permanent residential address.

B. Section 4-3.104 is hereby repealed.
